

Make your own Bunting – Activity

For almost **300 years** souvenirs are a popular way of marking Royal events! From coins, teapots to stamps! This home-made bunting could be your very own souvenir!

Special jubilees are usually named after precious stones! This one is named after a precious metal!

Queen Elizabeth II's Diamond Jubilee Pageant was called the 'world's largest outdoor party'. More than 1 million people watched 1,000 boats sail down the Thames!

Bunting has become very popular with summer parties, royal and sporting events.

Step 1: Colour in your bunting in red, white and blue! You can use pencils, pens and even glitter!

Step 2: Cut out the triangles with scissors. You may need an adult for this!

Step 3: Use a hole punch or poke a pencil in the circles to make holes for your string to go through. You may need an adult for this!

Step 4: Thread some string through the holes and hang your bunting up.

Step 5: Enjoy your Jubilee celebrations!
